

#### Medical Education → Competent Medical Practitioner

- Knowledge
- Skills, clinical, communication
- Attitudes, ethics



## What Interns are doing in the daily activities

- Usually the first doctor in the ward to admit a new case.
- The first one to initiate diagnostic investigations and treatment
- Follow instruction from seniors in subsequent management till discharge.
- A lot of practical works, close interaction with patient, family, colleagues of various disciplines.

Within One year, from a Student to a Registered Medical Practitioner.



### What is the hospital expectation towards interns

- Sound knowledge to make reasonable diagnosis and initiate appropriate treatment.
- 2. Good communication skill
- 3. Competent I.T. skill
- 4. Competent practical skill
- 5. Good working attitude.
  - Many incidents related to attitude.



#### Communication Skill

- Get the Right message and Give the Right message.
- Establish good rapport with patients.



#### I.T. Competent

- Now most work is CMS based
- Ordering investigations, tracing laboratory result, ordering prescription and discharge summary.
- CMS training before starting Internship.
- IT systems designed to avoid incidents, e.g. 2D barcoded.



#### **Practical Skill**

- Training of common procedure e.g. blood taking, IV drip
  - Phlebomists employed to relieve heavy work load.
- On job training of invasive procedures under supervision, e.g. Lumbar puncture, chest drain.
- Student years to get prepared ("Assistant Intern").



#### Attitudes

- Character building of students:
  - Not to be "immature, self-centered, emotionally fragile, and lack of compassion for their patients"
- Complaints from patients, ward staffs, supervisors.

Performed PV examination on a 12 years old girl for abdominal pain!



#### Important "Minor" points

- Patient identity:
  - Remove chest drain from wrong patient
  - Wrong cross-matched, blood taking
- - Click on wrong duration of drug treatment
  - Wrong dose and drug transcript
- How to 'complete' a task
  - Release tourniquet after blood taking
  - Not sending CSF specimen after L.P.



#### A Responsible Doctor: Behaviour

- With compassion and humanitarian qualities.
- Patient-centered approach:
  - E.g. not answering call, leave early.



#### Other staffs' expectation of interns

#### Nurses:

- Dress properly as a 'doctor': no slippers!
- Tidy up the working field after their work

#### CCE

– Give some response to CCE question during the orientation "Why do you want to be a doctor?"
