CUHK review

- Affirmations things partly done but still need to be consolidated
- Recommendations things not yet done
- Both will need to be included in an Action
 Plan and will be particularly looked for in the next round, probably 2012

CUHK Panel affirms the following actions

- A number of changes over the last few years that have taken place as a result of careful reflection on feedback.
- The *streamlining* of the programme so as to *reduce workload* and *stress* levels on students. Undoubtedly, further changes will *continue* to enhance the curriculum.

Programme review panel recommends

- 1. The *highly diverse* and *distributed management* is acknowledged, as is the on-going efforts to maintain consistency and communication across the programme. There will always be *variation* in the *quality of teaching* but there are a number of *suggestions* in the report that might assist the programme in improving the overall quality of teaching. For example,
- More explicit mentoring of teachers with low course and teaching evaluation (CTE) scores
- Rotation of teachers



Recommendations (cont'd)

- 2. While the variety of assessment strategies is commended, more could be done to explicitly *map* the multiple-choice questions (*MCQs*) and the short-answer questions (*SAQs*) to desired *learning outcomes*.
- 3. While the constraints of maintaining a database of *MCQs* are clear, students could receive more *feedback on common errors* as a matter of programme *policy*. Further *SAQs* are much easier to write and so students might be able to *view* their *scripts*.

Report from HK Medical Council Jan 2009

Recommendations for both CUHK & HKU to address:

- To emphasize the importance & enhance the teaching of *Patient Safety and Risk Management* in the MBChB and MBBS curricula;
- 2. To consider, in conjunction with other health science disciplines or faculties, the introduction of *inter-professional education*.



Recommendations to CUHK & HKU (cont'd)

- 3. To *lengthen* the period of the *pre-internship* experience from 6 weeks;
- 4. To place more emphasis on the teaching of *medical ethics* and *social responsibility*;
- 5. To strengthen the teaching of *communication skills* within *clinical* settings
- 6. To establish "Fitness to Practise" procedures and guidelines to address professional misconduct of students;

Recommendations to CUHK & HKU (cont'd)

- 7. To intensify systems that *monitor*, *evaluate*, *train* and *support* teachers, inclusive of *honorary* teachers;
- 8. To find an appropriate way to *publicly recognize honorary teachers*; and
- 9. To investigate the *reasons* behind the *high attribution* of academic clinicians and clinical staff to the private sector, and to develop strategies to *reverse* this trend



Specific Recommendations for CUHK

- 1. To incorporate *fewer didactic lectures* and *more small group* teaching in the *early* years of MB ChB;
- To place senior year students rotating through all specialties on-call to gain wider training & experience; and
- 3. To place further emphasis on *attracting* students to *research* programmes.
